Controlling oil transition by bringing John Davis's vision to life

John Davis, the founder of Kegel, had a vision:


One World - One Game - One Ball

Though Kegel benefited from increased lane oil sales, John believed the escalating volumes applied to lanes threatened to drown the sport he loved. In 1997, the same year Teen Masters began, John declared the sport of bowling to be in crisis.




John defined the Crisis as
**“the destruction of the balance between
bowling balls and lane oil.”**

More aggressive balls require more oil, which in turn, requires more aggressive balls. Matching up and 'whom you follow' became dominant factors in the outcome of competitions.



John's effort to combat the crisis as the Chairman of the World Tenpin Bowling Association's Technical Committee culminated in this 2006 recommendation:

*"We, the committee, understand a change in the bowling environment is required for the sport to grow to its full potential. We believe the first logical step toward this change is a **Regulation Bowling Ball** for top-level competition."*

Industry resistance prevented WTBA from moving forward with a regulation bowling ball; it took another seven years before one became a reality. Sadly, John passed on January 25, 2013, only five months before he would have seen his vision begin to take shape at the 2013 Teen Masters.



John's vision became our vision

We call it **SKILL** Bowling, and its goals are simple:

- Make oil transition gradual and predictable by restoring the balance between bowling balls and lane oil.
- Reduce the importance of variables beyond the control of the participants, such as "*whom you follow*."
- Offer competition in which "*the hand in the ball is more important than the ball in the hand*."



John's vision was put to the test at the 2022 Teen Masters

- All competitors were limited to a single **SKILL 3.02** ball.
- Every pair had the **SKILL 46** oil pattern on the left lane and the **SKILL 35** oil pattern on the right lane, each containing approximately **8.5 mL** of oil.
- The lanes were only oiled once daily as bowlers rolled six games on **Fresh, Burn, and Double Burn**.
- Totals for 18 games reduced the field to the top 25% of girls and boys who rolled another six games to determine the 12 girls and 12 boys who advanced to compete in round-robin match-play.



The SKILL 3.02

All bowlers were limited to using a single SKILL 3.02 throughout the five days of the competition.



Every pair was oiled once daily with SKILL 46 on the left lane and SKILL 35 on the right lane.


SKILL 46








